

# Invisible Warriors: Veterans in State Prisons

# Methodology

<u>Invisible Warriors: Veterans in State Prisons</u> examined how states identify veterans in their prison populations, whether through self-reporting, administrative records, or external verification systems. We also assembled a count of the total number of veterans in state prison, and, using that count, generated the percentage of the state's total prison population who identified as veterans and a ratio to indicate whether veterans were over- or underrepresented in prison compared to their prevalence in the community.

## **Data Collection**

We collected data on state prison populations and incarcerated veterans using publicly available sources and public records requests. The total number of people in state prison was identified for 48 states from state department of corrections websites. This method was also used to identify the number of veterans in state prison in six states. Two states confirmed that they do not track veteran status, leaving six states with complete data and 44 with partial information.

To fill in the gaps, we followed each state's contact protocols. For 21 states that provided direct email contacts, we contacted research or records staff and received responses from 20. For the remaining 23 states, we submitted formal public records requests and received 22 responses.

Our goal was to capture a consistent snapshot from June 2023, marking the end of the fiscal year just prior to data collection. However, due to varying response times and data availability, the final dataset includes counts from snapshots collected between June 2022 and May 2024, with most data points falling within 2023.

### **Information Verification Process**

To ensure accuracy and transparency, we contacted all 50 states to verify or correct the data we collected on how they identify veterans in prison and their most current count of veterans in state prisons. Although our data came from official sources—state reports, public records, or direct communication—we pursued this extra verification step to strengthen the reliability of our findings and foster collaboration with state agencies.

We gathered contact information for each state's corrections department leader and sent those officials a summary table of their state's data, asking them to confirm or correct it and share it with the appropriate staff. Within 28 days, we received responses from 19 states. A follow-up email to the remaining states yielded six more replies, bringing the total to 25.

Of these 25 states, 19 fully confirmed or corrected their data. Two provided partial confirmation, with outstanding questions that typically related to budget details. The remaining four contacts either acknowledged our request and referred us to another staff member, who had not responded by our publication deadline, or advised us to file a public records request. As of this writing, we have not received responses to any of those outstanding requests.

We were able to identify and verify the veteran identification method for 43 states and the count of veterans for 46 states. Table S2 provides state-level details.

#### **Veteran identification methods:**

- Twenty states used individual self-report of veteran status, typically collected during prison admission.
- Sixteen states used Veterans Re-Entry Search Service (VRSS).
- Seven states used both self-report and VRSS.
- A veteran identification method was not identified for three states.
- Two states do not record veteran status.
- Two states did not respond to the public records requests.

#### **Veteran counts:**

- Forty-six states provided a count of veterans directly or in published materials.
- Two states do not record veteran status.
- Two states did not respond to the public records requests.

## Share of Veterans in State Prison

To determine the share of veterans as a portion of the total state prison population in the 46 states with data, we divided the number of veterans identified in each state's prison system by the total prison population in that state. We used count data from a range of sources to match the time the veteran count was taken as closely as possible to the number of people in each state's prison system (Table S1). Table S2 below provides state-level details on the share of veterans in state prison.

## **Representation Ratios**

To assess whether veterans were proportionally represented in state prisons, we used population data from the 2020 Census and the VA's 2020 state veteran report to calculate a representation ratio for each state. Table S2 below provides state-level details.

We calculated the national representation ratio for the 46 states with available information using this formula:

(Total veterans in prison across 46 states/Total prison population of those states) / (Total veterans in the general population across those states/
Total population of those states)

This national ratio shows whether veterans are over- or underrepresented in state prisons overall. A ratio above 1 indicates overrepresentation; a ratio below 1 indicates underrepresentation.
